



Unemployment Rate

3.8%

(Decreased by 0.1% since February)

Total non-farm payroll employment rose by **303,000** in March, and the unemployment rate changed little at **3.8 percent**. Job gains occurred in health care, government, and construction. The number of long-term unemployed (those jobless for 27 weeks or more), at **1.2 million**, was little changed in March. The long-term unemployed accounted for **19.5 percent** of all unemployed people.

The number of people employed part time for economic reasons, at **4.3 million**, changed little in March. These individuals who would have preferred full-time employment, were working part-time because their hours had been reduced or they were unable to find full-time jobs. In March, the number of people not in the labor force who currently want a job, at **5.4 million**, was little changed.

In March, average hourly earnings for all employees on private nonfarm payrolls increased by 12 cents, or **0.3 percent**, to **\$34.69**. Over the past 12 months, average hourly earnings have increased by **4.1 percent**. In March, average hourly earnings of private-sector production and nonsupervisory employees edged up by **7 cents**, or **0.2 percent**, to **29.79**.
